
Kindy Academy

In the Garden

Wow it's Term 4 already and so much has happened and changed in our little school garden. We had a bountiful harvest last term of broccoli, snow peas, parsley, mint and rosemary. Our family enjoyed the fresh broccoli lightly steamed as well as in a beef stir-fry. Did your family manage to try some of the produce?



It's really heating up and the sharp change in weather means new plants for the garden. Currently we have lettuce, pumpkin, sweet potato, tomatoes, broad beans, garlic, strawberries, blueberries and herbs growing. 1/2S sowed seeds at the end of Term 3 and these are now seedlings ready for planting into the garden beds. These include silverbeet, yellow beans, green beans, cucumbers and corn. Last term the kids also had fun making up the Woolworths Discovery Pots, so thank you to those who donated spare pots. These pots are growing in the mini green house and you are welcome to use the spray bottles to give them a drink.



To add some fun in the garden, we have giant sunflower seedlings which will be spectacular in Connors Corner and compliment the flowering lavenders. We are looking to plant more low lying herbs into this area to grow around the beautiful mosaics made by the kids and their families. So please come and have a wander around and let the kids show you how proud they are of their school garden. Head Lice - K - 6

Just some information in regard to the ever dreaded head lice for you.

It is possible that your child may contract the condition at some point during the year.

It is helpful to check your child's hair for signs of lice infestation.

Unfortunately, the lice themselves are often hard to find because they move around on the head. Therefore, you should be looking for the eggs or nits. These appear as tiny silvery white specks attached to the hair shaft near the scalp. Dandruff and hairspray may look similar but these are easily brushed away. The eggs are hard to move and do not brush away. Other signs of lice infestation may be a red rash and scratch marks on the scalp, nape of the neck or behind the ears.

If your child has contracted head lice do not be alarmed. Although the condition is unpleasant, it is easily treated with specialised treatments available from the chemist. After treatment use a fine tooth comb to remove the dead lice and eggs.

Even though we are assured lice do not live in or on clothing and they need a blood source to survive, it is a good idea to wash school hats, clothes, towels and bed linen in hot water and detergent. Combs and brushes could also be washed in hot soapy water. If possible, after washing, these items should be put into the sun to dry.

As head lice are highly contagious and multiply at an unbelievable rate it is suggested that you examine and treat all members of the family at the same time.
